

There were two Peter Robinson Emigrations - one in 1823 and one in 1825. The 1823 people were settled in the Ottawa Valley and the 1825 people were settled in and around Downeyville (Emily Twp), Douro, Ennismore (The Gore of Emily), Asphodel, Marmora, Ops, Otonabee and Smith (including Young's Pt.)

THE GREAT DOWNEYVILLE IRISH CHALLENGE!


The Challenge: To find the most Irish person in the GDA. (Greater Downeyville Area)
